

Licence in the main is fine – I have a query at clause 5 regarding the Appendix and the wording, and have piked up a couple of typos.

I see that there is nothing about not removing any soil or doing anything to interfere with the support of the rest of the highway (normal wording suggested below) which may be advisable in this instance.

X. THE Licensee shall not remove any soil from the part of the highway to which this Consent relates or otherwise do anything which would interfere with the support given to the rest of the highway

Also, do we want to add another section to the termination clause at 12 to allow us to remove them if they mess about and do not keep them under control? If so, normal wording is something along the lines of the following -

Y. IF it appears to the Council at any time that any trees/shrubs to which this Licence relates are or are likely to obstruct or interfere in any way with or to be a source of danger to passage along the carriageway or any footway of the highway or to overhang the premises of any person or that any grass to which this Licence relates is not being regularly cut or mown the Council may without notice to the Licensee lop prune cut or trim such trees/shrubs as they think fit

Finally - what are the photos for as they are not referenced anywhere in licence?


